SAINT MEL

Mel is said to have been the son of Conis and his wife, Darerca, the sister of Saint Patrick. Mel accompanied his uncle to Ireland and helped to evangelize in that country. Mel is said to have had no fixed diocese, which might be explained by his being a missionary. Saint Patrick himself built the church at Ardagh and to this he appointed his nephew, Mel. The cathedral at Ardagh is dedicated to Saint Mel. Acting upon the counsel of Saint Paul, Mel supported himself by working with his hands, and what he gained beyond bare necessities, he gave to the poor. The Feast of Saint Mel is on February 6th.



GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO MASS

Effective the weekend of June 5-6, 2021, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass which had been suspended by the Catholic Bishops of Ohio because of the Covid 19 pandemic is restored. Bishop Malesic added to his announcement that "individuals (who) are homebound, are frail due to illness or age or in their well-formed consciences that going into public places - including Sunday worship and Mass-would place their health or the health of or the health of their loved one in serious jeopardy . ..are not bound by the obligation to attend Mass."

At the directive of Bishop Malesic, effective Wednesday, June 2, 2021, previous restrictions that have been in place regarding attendance at M Mass have been relaxed.

- Face masks and social distancing are no longer required, but are strongly suggested for anyone who remains unvaccinated.
- Hymnals will be restored and congregational singing is encouraged.
- Holy Water fonts will be refilled.
- Hand sanitizer will continue to be provided at all entrances to the church.
- The sign of peace is permitted though it should only be exchanged without physical contact to any outside of the same household.
- Distribution of the Precious Blood continues to be suspended.

SAVOR A SAINTLY SUMMER



The slower pace of summer offers opportunities to nurture faith in creative ways not feasible in hectic times. Consider these ideas:

Visit a shrine. Holy places where relics are preserved, an apparition has

taken place, or one that encourages a particular belief or devotion offer opportunities for prayer and pilgrimage. Look for directories of shrines in the U.S., including www.catholicshrines.net or from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) http://ow.ly/OYvJ30bAayl.

Attend daily Mass. Meeting God in the Eucharist begins a summer day with grace. Daily Mass is a full Catholic immersion in Christ, in the Sacraments, and the saints, all at once.

Gather with other Catholics. As we emerge from pandemic conditions, spending time with other Catholic friends can provide a community of faith-filled companions. Attend Mass together, socialize together, brainstorm Gospel-centered life solutions together.

Look for signs of God's love. Find a park or green space near you where you can center your heart and mind on Jesus. Observe His creation and become more aware of His presence.

WHAT IS SIN

Dealing with sin is uncomfortable and following God's rules is hard. While we may think we are "good" and others may look up to us, eventually God will decide if we have been "good." Since His opinion is the one that matters, His rules rule.

Sin is real. The world tells us that sin doesn't exist but Catholics know that "sin is a deliberate thought, word, deed, or omission contrary to the eternal law of God." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*) The law can be found in the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, and in Scripture. The law says sin is real.

Unconfessed sin separates us from God. "For you have hidden your face from us and have delivered us up to our guilt" (Isaiah 64:6). Avoiding guilt means missing God's forgiveness. Each evening, examine the day's actions and ask if they would please God or not. Resolve to do better and take steps to change. Seek absolution through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
